WORK HOURS: Scheduled work will be performed within Monday – Friday. 40-hour schedule. Occasional weekends, daytime, or evening work may be required.

JOB SUMMARY

The painter will apply paint, stain, and other coatings to surfaces such as walls, buildings, and bridges, ensuring both aesthetic appeal and protection against the elements. The employee will provide assistance to other maintenance workers and contractors with tasks involving air conditioning, mechanical and electrical problems when needed and will prepare surfaces, mix colors, and use various tools to apply finishes and will be under direct supervision of the Chief Maintenance Supervisor.

ESSENTIAL FUCTIONS

The following list was developed through a job analysis; however, it is not exhaustive, and other duties may be required and assigned. A person with a disability which is covered by the ADA must be able to perform the essential functions of the job unaided or with the assistance of reasonable accommodation.

- Assists in the performance of maintenance as needed.
- Provides assistance to other maintenance workers with other county-owned facilities and equipment when requested including air conditioning, mechanical or electrical equipment.
- Performs general electrical work installing new circuits, electrical systems, lights, plugs, and switches.
- Measures area to be painted; determines quantity and type of paint to use for the project.

- Identifies and orders appropriate paint colors and finishes, mixing if needed.
- Prepares surfaces to be painted, which may include removing prior finishes through chemicals, grit blast, or other methods.
- Masks, removes, covers, or otherwise protects furniture, hardware, trim, and other nonpainted surfaces.
- Applies paint to interior and exterior surfaces using brushes, rollers, sprayers, airbrushes, stencils, and other tools.
- Performs basic stencil and line work, which may include painting lines on factory floors, parking lots, and other surfaces.
- May apply wallpaper, specialty finishes, and glazes.
- Comply with chemical and waste storage and disposal regulations and best practices.
- Builds scaffolding according to safety regulations.
- Maintains a clean work area.
- Prepare invoices and other paperwork detailing material and costs.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

- Excellent organizational skills and attention to detail.
- Ability to follow instructions and provide consistent work.
- Must be able to distinguish among colors.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

- Completion of a formal apprenticeship program, previous experience, or on-the-job training required.
- Valid Driver License

ESSENTIAL ABILITIES

Work in this class includes sitting, walking, bending, stooping, and lifting weights of approximately 65 lbs. or less unassisted and weights over 65 lbs. with assistance. Employees must be able to maneuver in tight places such as climb ladders, step over obstacles, step on and off machinery, etc. Employees may be exposed to hazardous materials.
